This Hardy Mountain site is one of the last that remains in its original form. It is known to the Doukhobor people as the Makortoff village. The Mountain View Doukhobor Museum was founded in 1972 by its owner the late Peter M. Gritchen. The Museum features one of the last traditional communal village houses built circa 1912 and four sheds on 17 acres. The Land Conservancy (TLC) purchased the site in 2004. Work to restore the communal home and site is underway. Working and volunteer staff are on site and would be pleased to offer a tour.
